Our Barbecue is just around the corner on March 14. Brother Watts Ward is heading up this project.

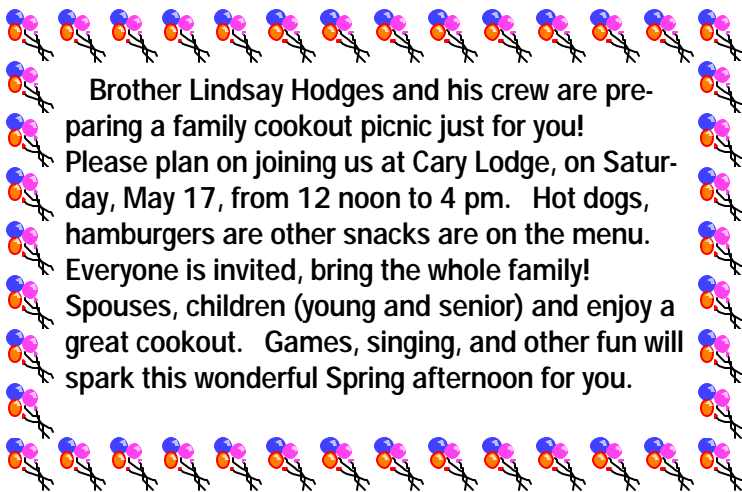
